The History of the Christmas Card.

Exchanging Christmas cards is a surprisingly recent tradition, the first formal card being for sale in 1843. Designed by an Englishman J.C. Horsley, the printed sentiment read "A Merry Christmas and a Happy New Year to you".

A thousand of the cards were printed and because it only cost a penny to mail a holiday hello, the cards sold like hot cakes and a new custom was born.
