Easing of COVID-19 Restrictions in Victoria

The Victorian Government has announced that new arrangements will come into effect at 11.59pm on Tuesday 12 May.

Please be aware this is **NOT** a "return to normal" situation.

- Visiting family and friends, Victorians are now able to leave their home, with a maximum of 5 people gathered together;
- Outdoor gatherings of 10 people or less;
- Private worship ceremonies of up to 10 people are permitted, plus those needed to run the service;
- Retail stores remain open, with 4 square meters per person limits.
