### The Origins behind one of our Christmas Traditions....

#### Reindeers drawing Father Christmas's sleigh

Until 1822 Father Christmas was said to do his rounds on foot or on a white horse. The change to the sleigh drawn by 8 reindeer is acknowledged as being the idea of New York Professor Clement Moore who in 1822 wrote a poem for his children entitled "A Visit from Saint Nicholas". In his poem the reindeer were given names to make the story more plausible and exciting, and so were born Dasher, Dancer, Prancer, Vixen, Comet, Cupid, Donner and Blitzen.





The idea for this probably came from Finland where legend tells of Old Man Winter, a mythical character who every year drove his reindeer down from the mountains

bringing the snow with him. While the reindeer hail from Finland, a place traditionally associated with Father Christmas, the idea is really of American origins, based on a Finnish legend.

#### The Australian version.....

"Six White Boomers" is a song written by Rolf Harris and John .D. Brown and released on the Columbia label in 1961; and tells the tale of Santa doing his rounds with "boomers" (a colloquialism for a male kangaroo) not reindeers.
