This week in History.....

March 23 –

- 1857 Elisha Otis installs his first elevator at Broadway, New York.

- 2011 Elizabeth Taylor dies of heart failure, aged 79.

March 24-

- 1947 John. D. Rockefeller Jr donates New York City East River site to the United Nations and staff first started working in the building in 1950.

- 1997 Australian parliament overturns the world's first euthanasia law.

March 25-

- 1807 the bill for the abolition of slavery is signed by King George 111 of the United Kingdom. Though the slave trade was outlawed it continued in some Caribbean countries, and it would not be completely outlawed until 1833.

March 26-

- 1484 William Caxton prints his translation of Aesop's Fables, as the first person to introduce the printing press to England in 1476.

- 1953 Dr. Jonas Salk announces that he has successfully tested a vaccine to prevent polio, clinical trials began the next year.

March 27-

- 1909 For the first time fingerprint evidence is used to solve a murder case. The world's first official Fingerprint Bureau was founded in Scotland Yard in 1901. The world's first Fingerprint Bureau opened in Calcutta, India in 1897.
