This Week in History... 6 April 1896

Pierre, baron de Coubertin, a founder of the International Olympic Committee and its president from 1896 to 1925, realized his goal of reviving the Olympics when the first modern games opened in Athens.

7 April 1909

Americans Robert Peary and Matthew Henson became the first men to reach the North Pole.

8 April 1820

The famous ancient Greek statue, Venus (or Aphrodite) de Milo is discovered on the Aegean island of Milos.

9 April 2005

Having met for the first time at a polo match in 1970, Charles, Prince of Wales, who is first in line to the British throne, married Camilla Parker Bowles, who one day will become Queen Consort.

10 April 1912



The RMS Titanic embarked on its maiden voyage ending in tragedy several days later when the luxury liner hit an iceberg and sunk, 1504 lives were lost.

11 April 1957

The British government allows the island colony of Singapore to govern itself under a new constitution agreed in London.

12 April 1606

The Union Flag, precursor to the Union Jack, was adopted as national flag of Great Britain.

The design of the Union Jack dates back to the Act of Union in 1801 which united the Kingdom of Great Britain and the Kingdom of Ireland (on paper at least!).
