Hester Canterbury House Keeping Continued....

Over the years there has been regular feedback from residents fearful that they would be unable to hear the alarms or the warning system in an emergency situation.

It has also been a concern to residents that prior to the regular scheduled testing of the **FIP** *(Fire Indicator Panel)* that it is very difficult to hear the announcement made over the loud speaker system.

Therefore consideration has been given to installing an emergency warning speaker in each of the Hester Canterbury apartments. This is seen to be a very worthwhile action and a very positive safety measure for BASScare to take concerning the well being of all residents, especially those challenged with hearing issues. **Please note** there will be **NO** cost to any individual, the cost incurred will be funded by the LTMF (Long Term Maintenance Fund).

This will mean that when announcements or the Fire Indicator Panel is activated it will be very loud and could cause alarm especially if triggered in the middle of the night. (It is *not* possible for the speakers to be adjusted to individual residents' requirements).

Your safety is to be held as the highest priority over any such temporary discomforts in an emergency situation. If you have any feedback it is welcomed and management is happy to meet and answer any questions or concerns you may have. Alternatively you can also discuss the matter with any of the Residents' Committee members. There will be more information on this matter in future newsletters.
